# Governance & Regulatory Bodies

---

Stakeholders responsible for the rules, structure, and governance of pétanque at international, continental, national, and district levels. This document describes how each governing body interacts with Pétanque Life, their organizational needs, and how the platform supports their mission.

---

## International Level

### FIPJP (Fédération Internationale de Pétanque et Jeu Provençal)

**Role:** Supreme governing body for pétanque worldwide. Sets rules, manages Olympic relations, homologates equipment. Headquarters in Marseille, France.

**Motivation:** Growing the sport globally, achieving Olympic recognition, maintaining integrity and standardization across 100+ member nations. **Pain**

**Points:** Coordinating across vastly different national federations, language barriers, ensuring consistent rule interpretation worldwide, demonstrating sport's global reach to IOC. **Organizational Journey:** Founded 1958 → Established global ruleset → Built confederation structure → Pursuing Olympic recognition → Modernizing governance.

## FIPJP Executive Committee (ComEx)

## FIPJP Specialized Commissions

### International Umpire and Rules Commission

**Role:** Draft, revise, and interpret the Official Rules of Pétanque. Certify international umpires. **Motivation:** Clear, fair rules that serve the sport; competent, consistent officiating worldwide. **Pain Points:** Rules that don't

anticipate every situation, inconsistent interpretation across nations, umpire quality variation.

<b>Rules Management</b>	The drafting and publication system for official rules. Version control tracks every change with discussion history and rationale. Comment system allows commission members to debate proposals asynchronously. Translation workflow ensures all language versions are consistent. ## Medical Commission

**Role:** Anti-doping compliance (WADA), Therapeutic Use Exemptions, player welfare. **Motivation:** Clean sport, player health and safety, WADA compliance for Olympic eligibility. **Pain Points:** Limited testing resources, TUE complexity, coordinating with national anti-doping agencies.

## Disciplinary Commission

## Other Continental Confederations (CAP, Americas, Asia, Oceania)

**Role:** Regional governance following CEP model, adapted to their region's scale and development stage. **Motivation:** Developing pétanque in their region, organizing continental championships, supporting emerging federations. **Pain Points:** Smaller membership bases, vast geographic distances, varying levels of federation maturity, limited resources.

<b>CMS Content Management</b>	Regional content management for smaller confederations. Publish continental championship information, federation news, and development program updates. The CMS scales to confederation size - smaller confederations need simpler tools. Multi-language support for regional languages. The system helps identify central locations, coordinate with national calendars, and ensure fair rotation of hosting duties.
<b>Communication</b>	Coordinating with member nations across language barriers and varying technology access. Multi-language support essential. The system accommodates federations with limited internet access through email digests and offline-capable features. Building community among geographically dispersed members.

## National Level

### National Federation President

**Role:** Chief executive, legal representative, external relations. The face of pétanque in their country. **Motivation:** Growing the sport nationally, successful international representation, organizational excellence, legacy. **Pain Points:** Volunteer-based organization with limited resources, balancing competing stakeholder interests, government relations, managing board dynamics.

**Organizational Journey:** Elected by member clubs → Builds leadership team → Sets strategic direction → Represents federation externally → Leaves legacy for successor.

## National Sports Director (NSD)

**Role:** Responsible for the "product" - tournaments, annual calendar, format approvals, National Sport Committee oversight. The operational leader for competition. **Motivation:** Vibrant competition calendar, fair ranking system, quality events, player satisfaction. **Pain Points:** Calendar conflicts, inconsistent event quality, ranking disputes, balancing elite and grassroots competition.

## National Secretary

## National Treasurer

**Role:** Financial steward - affiliation fees, insurance policies, tax obligations, national team funding. Guardian of federation resources. **Motivation:** Financial sustainability, proper stewardship, transparency, supporting federation activities. **Pain Points:** Chasing late payments, budget constraints, insurance complexity, volunteer time limitations.

<b>Payment Processing</b>	Handling money in and out. Online payment acceptance for fees. Expense reimbursement for officials and volunteers. National team funding disbursement. The system modernizes federation finances from checks and manual tracking to efficient digital processing. Approval workflows for expenditures. Audit trail for all transactions.
<b>Financial Reports</b>	Generating reports for various audiences. Board reports for governance oversight. AGM reports for member transparency. Auditor reports for compliance. Grant reports for government funders. The treasurer can produce professional reports without accounting expertise. Customizable formats for different needs. Historical comparison for trend analysis.
<b>Budget Management</b>	Planning and tracking federation spending. Annual budget creation with category breakdown. Real-time tracking against budget. Variance analysis and forecasting. The system supports responsible financial planning and early warning of budget issues. Multi-year planning for major initiatives. Scenario modeling for decision support.

## Regional Counselors

**Role:** Elected representatives from geographic regions, bringing local concerns to national board. The voice of grassroots pétanque. **Motivation:** Representing their region's interests, supporting local clubs, ensuring fair resource allocation.

**Pain Points:** Limited influence on national decisions, communication challenges with dispersed clubs, balancing regional vs national priorities.

## Discipline Committee

**Role:** Process complaints and disciplinary actions, adjudicate code of conduct violations. Guardians of fair play and sportsmanship. **Motivation:** Fair treatment for all parties, maintaining sport integrity, consistent application of rules, deterrence of misconduct. **Pain Points:** Incomplete information, he-said-she-said situations, proportionate sanctions, appeals and challenges.

## By Skill Level

**Role:** Plays for leisure, often without a federation license. Uses "leisure boules" (smooth, uniform weight). **Role:** The CEO of the event - manages logistics, schedule, insurance compliance, and post-event reporting to federation. The TD is ultimately responsible for everything that happens at the tournament. **Motivation:** Successful events, player satisfaction, club/federation recognition, personal satisfaction from well-run competitions. **Pain Points:** Weather disruptions, no-shows affecting draws, disputes between players, time pressure, volunteer coordination. **User Journey:** Appointed/volunteers → Plans event → Opens registration → Manages entries → Runs event day → Handles issues → Submits reports → Receives feedback.
